Advance solutions for challenges facing society

 Our urban centers are on the front lines of advancing solutions that increase socioeconomic mobility. These include access to quality, affordable housing; vibrant, connected neighborhoods; good jobs; meaningful workforce preparation; and reliable transit. The Kresge Foundation is committed to advancing this reality. In 2018, The Kresge Foundation committed 98 grants totaling \$23,070,740 to organizations in Detroit.

Give voice to the people they serve

 Kids' Food Basket has conducted its anti-hunger campaign for over 15 years. Now serving communities in Grand Rapids and Muskegon, the organization provides nearly 8,200 school-aged children with sack suppers every day. As part of their mission, KFB encourages the community's youth to understand hunger challenges: a full third of their donated hours come from volunteers under age 18.

Contribute to vibrant communities

The Detroit Zoological Society is a leader in wildlife conservation and animal welfare that
inspires the community. With 261 employees and more than 1,000 volunteers, the
Detroit Zoo accommodates more than 1.3 million visitors annually as the largest paid
family attraction in the state.

Advance solutions for challenges facing society

 Based in Traverse City, Conflict Resolution Services provides high-quality professional dispute resolution services. In one year alone, CRS served over 800 individuals and volunteer mediators donated more than 500 hours of their time facilitating over 300 cases.

- Employs 397,128 people almost 11% of the state workforce
- Pays almost \$20 billion in wages annually
- Generates more than \$81.3 billion in annual revenues
- Holds assets of \$232.7 billion
- Michigan foundations annually give over \$1.6 billion
- Michiganders give almost \$5 billion to charity each year, representing 3 percent of household income
