Deliver vital community services

The American Indian College Fund helps Native American students, providing them with support through scholarships and funding toward higher education. From 2017-2018, the College Fund distributed over \$7 million in direct support to students.

Give voice to the people they serve

Mercy Housing has served more than 152,000 people by participating in the development, preservation and/or financing of more than 48,200 affordable homes. Mercy Housing's goal is to support efforts to promote policies—both legislative and regulatory—aimed at improving housing opportunities for those in need.

Contribute to vibrant communities

Started 30 years ago, the Colorado Nonprofit Association has made Colorado nonprofits stronger by leading research on charitable giving trends. The Association also advocates for nonprofits with policymakers on issues such as how to incentivize charitable giving, create efficiencies in the services nonprofits deliver, and promote accountability.

Advance solutions for challenges facing society

The Leighty Foundation is a family foundation that is committed to enhancing the impact of Colorado's nonprofits. Each year, it awards grants to area organizations working on issues such as education, health, environmental sustainability, and fostering community. In order to leverage charitable giving even further, the foundation provides considerable funding to organizations who seek to grow their volunteer programs.

- Employs nearly 190,000 almost 8% of the state's workforce
- Generates more than \$30 billion in annual revenues
- Holds assets of \$65 billion
- Colorado foundations annually give over \$834 million
- Coloradoans give \$3.4 billion to charity each year, representing 2.87 percent of household income
