# **Public Charities and Foundations Benefit Indiana Communities**

### **Deliver vital community services**

As the largest arts institution in the tri-state area, the Evansville Philharmonic Orchestra
partners with other performing arts groups in the area to put on both professional and
youth concerts each year. Dedicated to community enrichment, EPO offers schoolbased and personalized music instruction to over 13,000 students each year.

### Give voice to the people they serve

 The world's first school of philanthropy was established in Indiana's very own capital city in 2012: the Indiana University Lilly Family School of Philanthropy. The school aims to help graduates maximize their impact in societies both at home and abroad, and has seen skyrocketing rates of enrollment since its opening. 93 percent of graduates seeking jobs have been placed, including 100 percent of bachelor's degree graduates.

#### Contribute to vibrant communities

 From its founding in 1990 to 2014, the Sycamore Land Trust has protected more than 8,000 acres of land, including 300 additional acres for the Patoka River National Wildlife Refuge. In 2015 alone, Sycamore protected \$2.2 million worth of land. Its Li'l Hikers program brings families together to introduce children to the beauty of the natural resources native to Northern Indiana.

### Advance solutions for challenges facing society

 The Indiana Association of United Ways amplifies the impact of its 61 member charitable organizations working in the area. In 2014, 21 of those organizations banded together to hold 55 Kindergarten Camps for over 1,000 young students in 42 schools, who showed an average of 20% growth in pre-literacy skills.

- Indiana foundations annually give \$1.48 billion
