Public Charities and Foundations Benefit New Hampshire Communities

Improve the communities

• Catholic Charities of New Hampshire runs Cooking Matters, a national program that provides nutrition information and gives lessons in creating healthy meals on a limited budget. In 2014, 598 people graduated from this program (the largest in the nation) and 71% of the adults are eating more vegetables and 67% of teens are eating more fruits.

Provide nurturing environment for girls to succeed

• The Girl Scouts of the Green and White Mountains serves more than 9,000 girls with the guidance of more than 3,500 dedicated volunteers across New Hampshire and Vermont. In addition to the traditional after-school programs and outdoor activities, the girls contribute thousands of hours to community service projects.

Economic Impact of New Hampshire's Nonprofit Sector

- Employs 85,600 people, 16.7% of the state's workforce
- Generates almost **\$11.8 billion** in annual revenues
- Holds assets of nearly \$13.86 billion
- New Hampshire foundations annually give over \$121 million
- New Hampshirites give **\$547 million** to charity each year, representing **1.85 percent** of household income

Contribute to vibrant communities

• The Fidelity Foundation, the philanthropic arm of Fidelity Investments, has a focus on arts and culture. Using a businessmodel approach, the Foundation looks for strategic and transformational projects and has provided \$200 million to nonprofits across the United States and Canada. In the state, the Currier Museum of Art received funding for its internationally recognized collection.

Helping moms have healthy babies

• The March of Dimes New Hampshire Chapter funds research to understand birth defects and premature birth and to find treatments. Last year, the chapter supported three Centering Pregnancy programs in the Keene, Concord, and Lebanon areas. Centering Pregnancy is a model of group care that includes health assessment, education, and support. Note: The "nonprofit sector" encompasses organizations that are defined as tax-exempt under section 501(c) of the Internal Revenue Code. This includes both public charities and private foundations [501(c)(3)] and other nonprofits such as civic league organizations [501(c)(4)]. Exceptions are noted when relevant.
