Methodology: The sample size for the survey is 1,005 registered voters nationwide taken from a listed sample. 705 interviews were collected using automated telephone technology and 300 were collected using mobile web interviews. The margin of error is +/- 3.1%. Interviews were conducted October 7-10, 2019 by TPC Research. Percentages may not equal 100% due to rounding.
