Deliver vital community services

Empire Health Foundation serves seven counties in predominantly rural Eastern Washington. Using an \$18 million pool of funds for grantmaking, it strives to make this region the healthiest in the state by focusing on the areas of healthcare access, education, wellness, research, and public policy. The advances have led to an 8% decrease in childhood obesity and 61% decrease in out-of-school suspensions. **Give voice to the people they serve**

Marguerite Casey Foundation's work focuses on creating a national movement of families advocating for poverty alleviation. In the first decade after its founding in 2001, its grantees have engaged more than 1.5 million community members and have conducted numerous community, state, and national policy campaigns.

Contribute to vibrant communities

Although it is better known for its international work, the Gates Foundation has also invested more than \$1 billion in organizations serving Washington State. The causes it focuses on include providing quality education, reducing family homelessness, and supporting vulnerable families.

Advance solutions for challenges facing society

Every day in this country, 1,900 children become victims of abuse or neglect. The Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) for Children is a network of nearly 1,000 community-based programs that recruit, train, and support citizen-volunteers to advocate for the best interests of children while in foster care.

Economic Impact of Washington Nonprofit Sector

- Employs 211,400 over 9% of the state's workforce
- Generates more than **\$64.6 billion** in annual revenues
- Holds assets of \$208.8 billion
- Washington foundations annually give over \$3.9 billion
- Washingtonians give \$4.4 billion to charity each year, representing 3.08 percent of household income
