

Nonprofit Issues National Survey

Key Findings

- 1. Americans overwhelmingly support restoring and expanding a charitable deduction for everyone.
- 2. Momentum for nonprofit engagement and education of lawmakers remains strong.
- 3. Huge majority support nonprofits having an official "seat at the table."
- 4. Americans overwhelmingly support extending federal employer tax credits to nonprofit employers. Messages that highlight how nonprofits address pressing challenges and uplift those in need help drive down opposition and increase support.
- 5. Strong support for keeping the ban on charities endorsing candidates and political parties, inclusive of political party or church attendance.
- 6. Americans are most likely to support or donate to nonprofits when they advocate for an issue impacting their community and issues they care about.




Expanding Charitable Tax Deduction

87% Support Restoring \$300 Deduction

About 90% of Americans cannot claim a deduction for their charitable contributions. Congress previously passed a law allowing everyone to claim a charitable tax deduction of up to \$300, but let it expire in 2021. Would you support or oppose restoring the law that allows everyone to receive a tax break when they make charitable contributions?

Would you support or oppose expanding the charitable tax deduction for donating up to \$4,500 for every American?








Nonprofit Employers Messaging

84% Support Extending Business Tax Credits

Nonprofit organizations are major employers but are currently excluded from federal business tax credits for offering their employees childcare, retirement plans, or paid family leave. These credits usually focus on income tax, and nonprofits by definition do not have income. Some people have proposed that we should extend these credits to nonprofit employers. Nonprofit Employers Messaging



Nonprofit organizations are an economic force, providing over 12 million jobs – more than 10 percent of the private w orkforce. They may not have income, but they pay \$65 billion every year in federal payroll taxes.

Nonprofit employers pay all the taxes that they ow e, and they need to be able to attract qualified employees. We should level the playing field betw een nonprofit and for-profit employers and treat them fairly.






87% Support Extending Credits After Messaging

Initial: Total Support 84% | Total Oppose: 16% Informed: Total Support 87% | Total Oppose: 13%






Nonprofit Involvement in Government, Politics, and Their Communities






90% Support Nonprofits Educating Policymakers and Businesses

Total Support: 90% | Total Oppose: 10%






78% Think Voting Assistance A Good Idea



73% Keep Johnson Amendment


The Johnson Amendment is a provision in the US Tax code from 1954 that prohibits charitable organizations, including churches from either endorsing or opposing political candidates. Do you think that we should keep the law in place and continue to prohibit these organizations from endorsing political candidates, or should we repeal the law and allow charities and churches to endorse political candidates?





71% Support Policies Clarifying Dos and Don'ts For Nonprofits

While charities are not allowed to be involved directly in political campaigns, they are allowed to speak out on issues that matter to them and their community. However, the law that governs what Charities can or cannot say or do has many gray areas and can be difficult for charities to understand. Would you support or oppose policies that keep in place the ban on endorsing candidates and political parties and establish a clearer definition of what is and is not allowed when conducting nonpartisan civic engagement?





Increasing Advocacy Popular Among Those Open to Volunteering and Donating

44%

Said they are "more likely" to donate to all three advocacy statements. (Helped you advocate on an issue you care about, advocated for an issue impacting your community, and advocated for an issue impacting disadvantaged groups).

80%

Said they are "more likely" to donate to at least *one* of the three advocacy statements.

Among these groups who indicate that engagement in advocacy plays a role in their decision to donate, a higher percentage express intentions to increase their volunteer commitments and elevate their charitable contribution. Enhanced advocacy efforts by nonprofits hold the potential to influence a large group of individuals who are open to volunteering and increasing their charitable donations.
