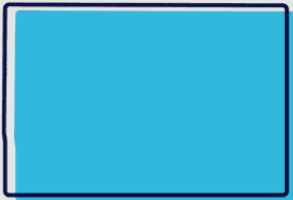

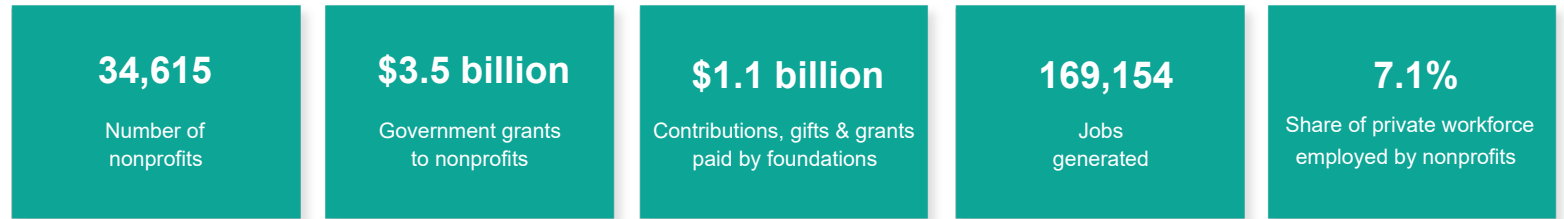

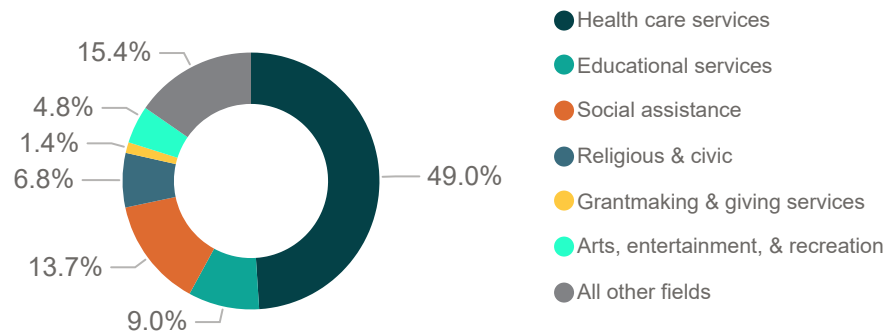

In Colorado, nonprofit organizations:

<p>Deliver vital community services</p> <p>The American Indian College Fund seeks to transform communities by ensuring that every Native student who wants to pursue higher education can do so. The Denver-based fund has invested over \$310.6 million into Native communities and awarded nearly 160,000 scholarships since it was founded in 1989.</p>	<p>Advance solutions for societal challenges</p> <p>The Colorado Health Foundation's mission is to improve the health of all Coloradans by creating health equity for those who have less power, privilege, and income. Each year, the foundation awards nearly \$100 million in grants to community partners whose work supports this mission.</p>
<p>Contribute to vibrant communities</p> <p>The Colorado Nonprofit Association seeks to transform the state's nonprofit landscape through education, professional development, and advocacy. In 2023, the organization hosted 90 virtual, live, recorded, and in-person courses that were attended by 2,100 registrants, as well as 40 roundtables.</p>	<p>Give voice to the people they serve</p> <p>Operating since 1993, Mercy Housing Colorado provides affordable housing to nearly 3,000 low-income individuals and families across 17 communities in the region. More than a third of the people they serve are children.</p>
